# **LIFE IN SIXTH FORM**

The College is fortunate to have a thriving and growing Sixth Form. Our curriculum is continually expanding and under review to meet demand and expectation. Students entering Sixth Form have a choice of a range of subjects at A Level.

## INDUCTION

On arrival into Year 13, the students follow a busy induction programme which lays out the expectations for Sixth Form at Strangford College.

The Year 13 students take part in a residential at Lorne where they participate in bush craft and outside team building activities which help establish relationships amongst Sixth Form students and staff alike. They explore and evaluate the leadership roles on offer in Strangford College. This residential encourages students to forge lasting and resilient relationships in line with the strong integrated ethos of Strangford College.



## PASTORAL SUPPORT IN THE SIXTH FORM

At Strangford College, we know our students well, and we ensure that they feel highly valued and secure at all stages of their academic career. Sixth Form is led by a Learning Coordinator, who is the Head of Year. Every class also has a form tutor who is responsible for the welfare, progress and development of the students in their care. The Form Tutor is an important link between home and college and will liaise closely with parents on matters of mutual concern related to the student's well-being and happiness. The School has the services of a Student Counsellor, provided by Family Works and two Chaplains. The Deputy Principal has overall responsibility for Pastoral Care at Strangford College.

# ► INDEPENDENT LEARNING

Private supervised study is facilitated in a recently refurbished Sixth Form study area. The effective use of private study is a key factor in determining a student's performance in the Sixth Form. Sixth Form students also have the use of a Sixth Form Centre where peer relationships can be developed and extended in a caring and social environment.

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# ROLE MODELS

Our School Council allows students of all ages to take leadership roles and contribute to the democratic processes at Strangford College. Leadership at Strangford College is demonstrated in lessons, assemblies, on the sports field, in our charity work and in the deeprooted way that our older students take responsibility to serve as role models to younger members of the College Community.

Many of the Sixth Form students are selected as prefects and assist in Junior school form classes and provide support in Maths and English lessons, acting as Literacy and Numeracy Mentors. By helping out in form classes, our Sixth Form students actively build relationships with their younger counterparts and this adds to the spirit of community that is at the very heart of our College.

### OTHER ACTIVITIES

In Year 14, there is a residential in Corrymeela giving students the opportunity to reflect on their time in Strangford College. Students openly discuss their hopes and fears for the future and receive support on how to cope with important decision-making processes. Alongside the team building exercises and essential bonding time with their classmates, the students learn how to prepare themselves either to move on to Further and Higher Education or to the world of work.



### PREFECT SYSTEM

Our society needs more people with exceptional leadership skills. We need individuals who can analyse what is required, take balanced decisions and who are driven by a deep sense of what is right. Our Head Boy and Head Girl are more than mere figure heads; they lead our students and represent the College at public occasions.

As well as our Deputy Head Boy and Girl we have house prefects and senior prefects who are role models for the younger students.

Our four houses, Mahee, Ogilby, Sketrick and Taggart, named after islands in Strangford Lough, are led by House Captains and this system brings students together in a wide range of house competitions. All students and staff belong to a house and this develops our Strangford College family atmosphere. Competitions range from sport, music and drama to pumpkin carving, creative writing and busking, to name but a few! # REPRESENTATIVE BODIES

We are a UNICEF's Rights Respecting School. We have achieved this award through our Shared Education Project with Glastry and St Columba's colleges. Our students focus on 6 rights which pervade all that we do at Strangford. These rights were chosen by the students:

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# PROGRESSION / PATHWAYS

A high quality careers programme is provided throughout the College, including careers education, information, advice and guidance. Students participate in work experience and take part in mock interview workshops to prepare them for university entrance and for seeking employment. Outside agencies visit the College to discuss career options and we have established links with a number of universities. The majority of Year 14 students progress to university and college.
