Main Role

Responsibilities

- To ensure children acquire and consolidate music knowledge, skills and understanding.

- To plan opportunities to contribute to children's Music knowledge and to their personal, spiritual, moral, social and cultural development.
- To assist with school productions and concerts throughout the year.
- To provide high quality music support for assemblies.
- Along with other members of staff, to organise and contribute to any concerts, displays and activities requested.
- To ensure the effective scheduling of peripatetic lessons and the recruitment of excellent instrument and singing teachers.
- To ensure a wide range of high quality extra-curricular activities are available to children including ensembles, choirs and peripatetic lessons.
- To critically evaluate teaching to improve effectiveness, identifying potential performing scholars and reporting those pupils to the Head of Music/CLT.
- To assist potential music scholars with appropriate preparation.
- To keep up to date with developments in the subject area at each key stage and teaching practice and pedagogy.
